## HOTSPOTS

- Lack of access to all three basic services remains a problem in Emalahleni, Emfuleni and Madibeng.
- In Emalahleni, Emfuleni and Madibeng, residents have also resorted to digging their own pit toilets, with many residents highlighting the serious health and safety risks associated with these toilets.

## GOOD NEWS

- There is an improvement in access to adequate water in Witzenberg and Msunduzi.
- Toilet cleaning has improved in Mossel Bay and Witzenberg.
- Residents in Witzenberg reported that broken toilets have been fixed and they have also received refuse bags.
