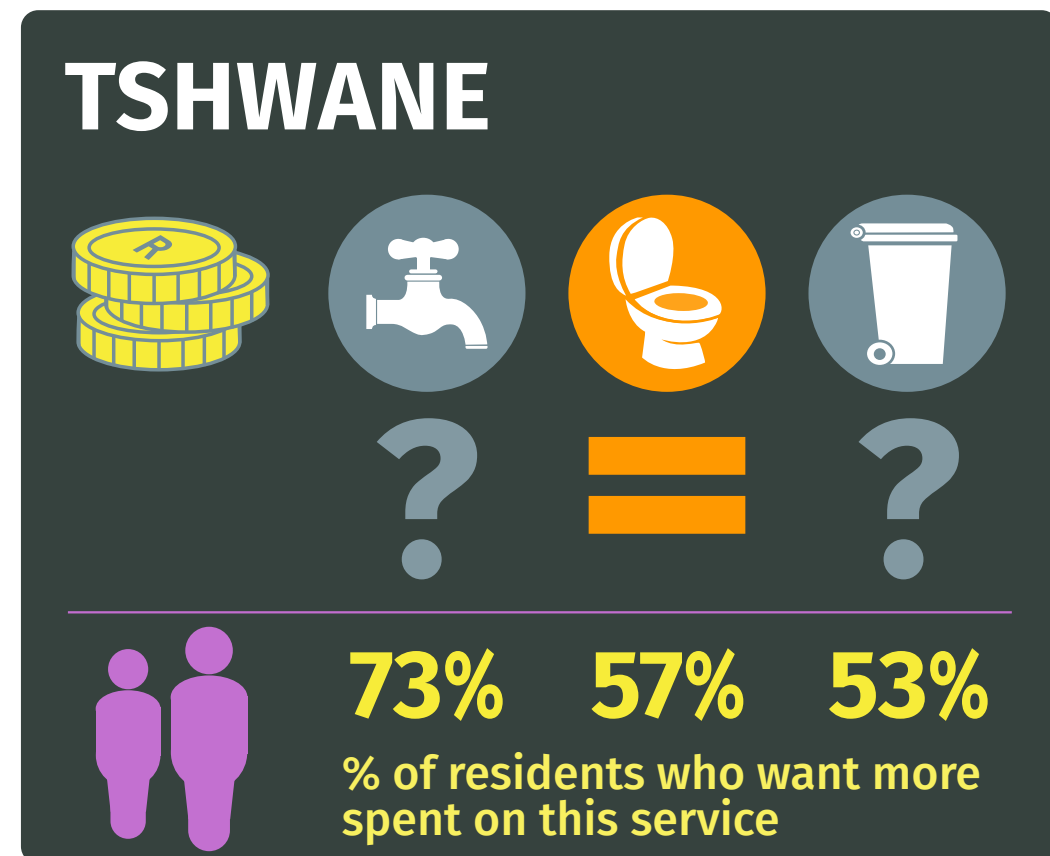
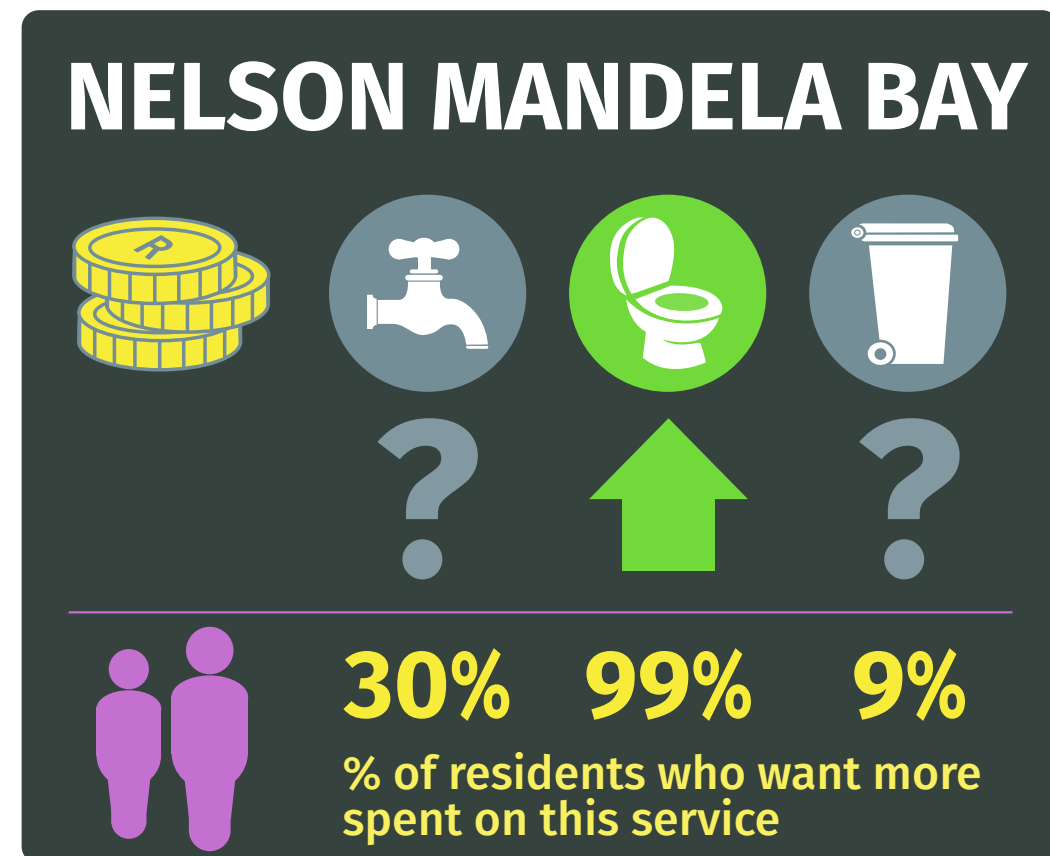
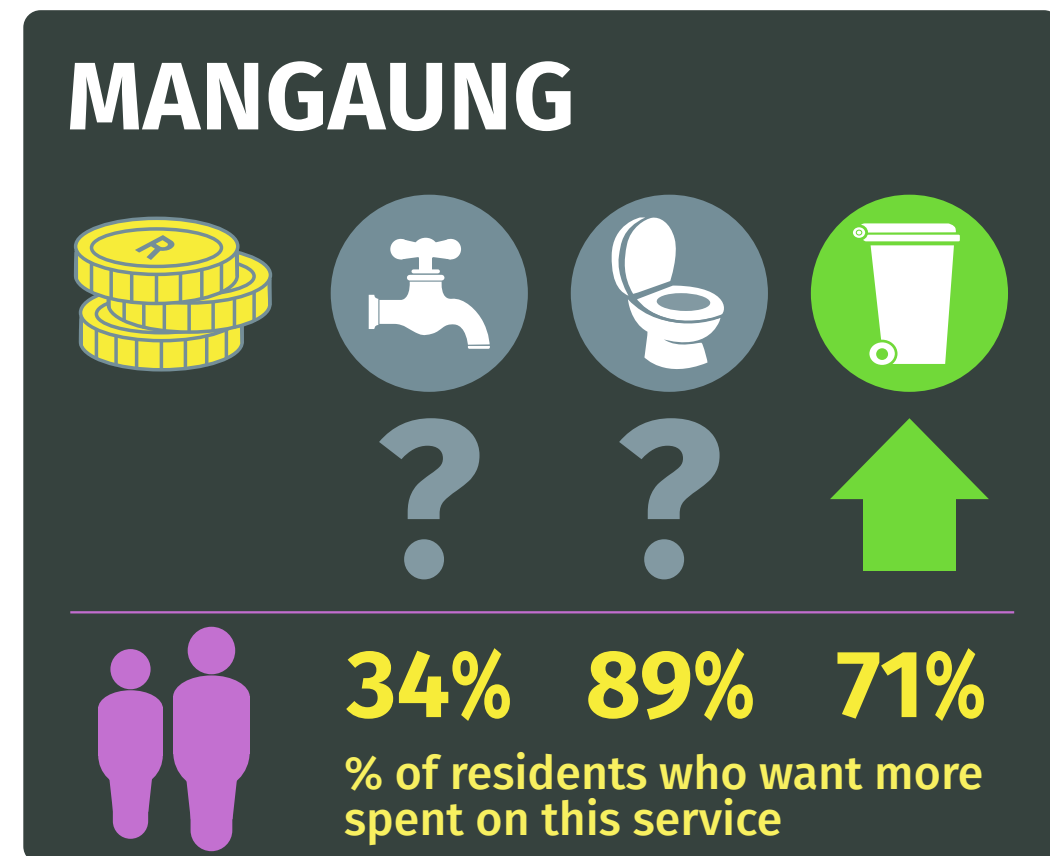
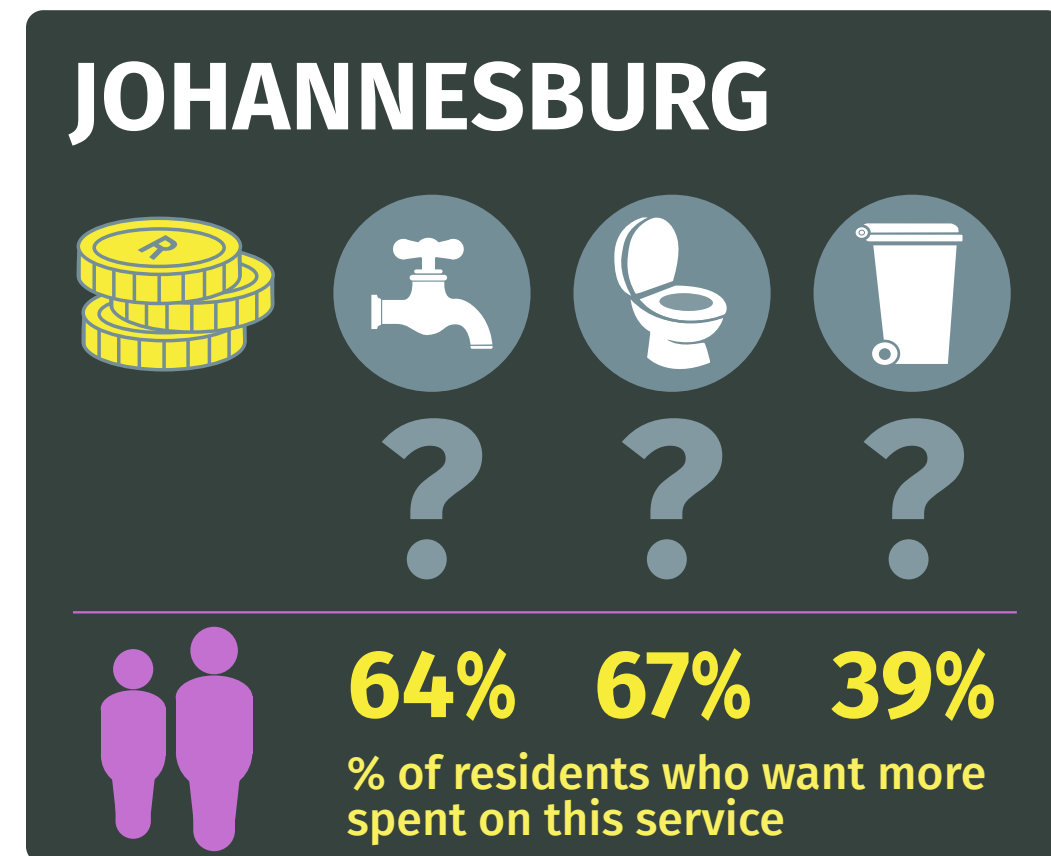
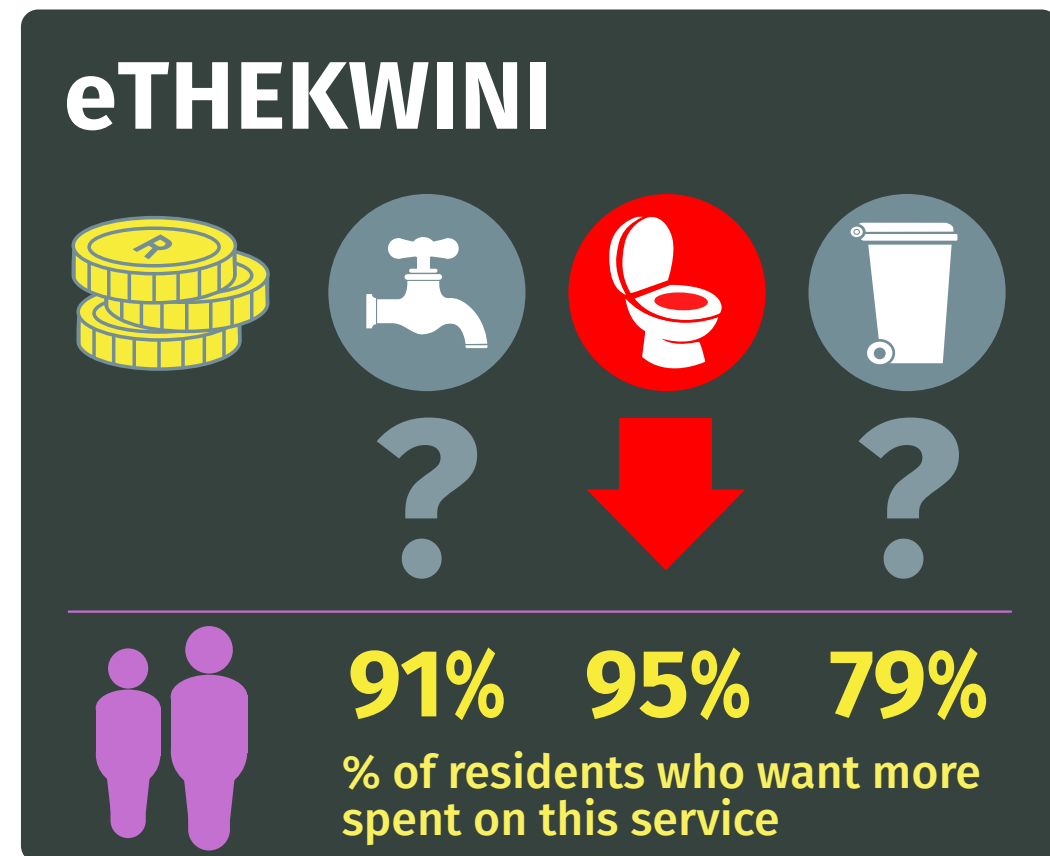
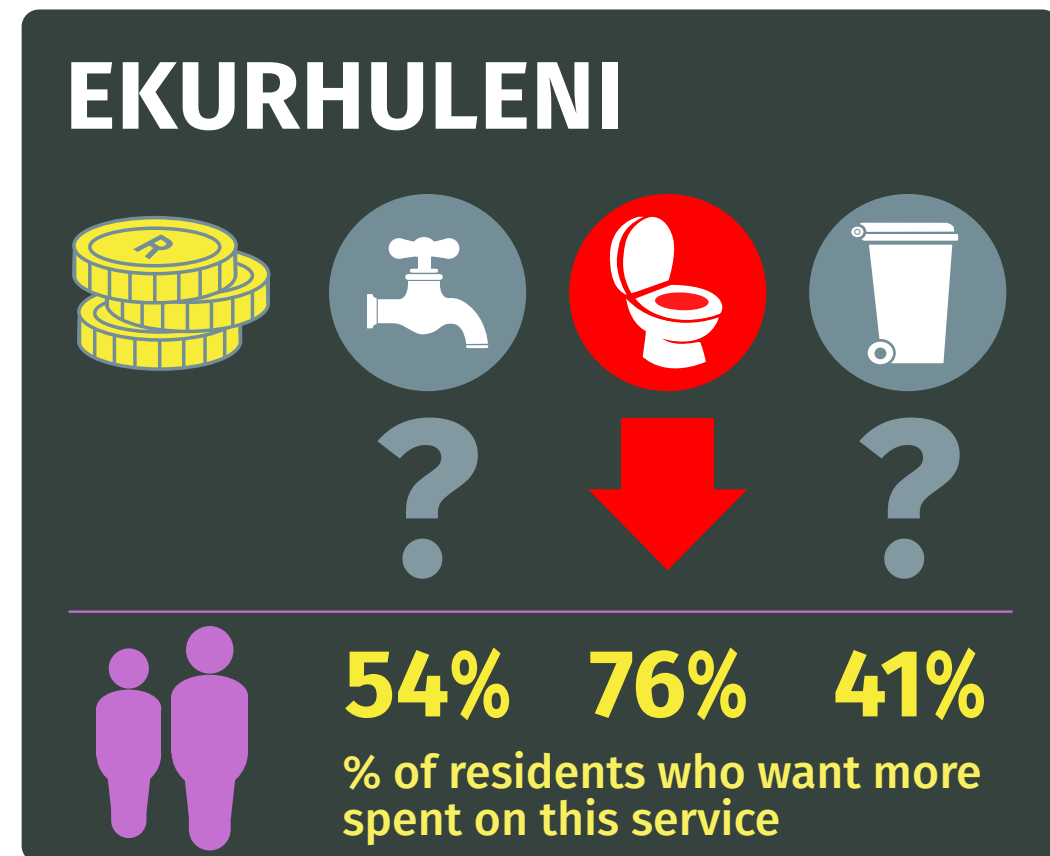
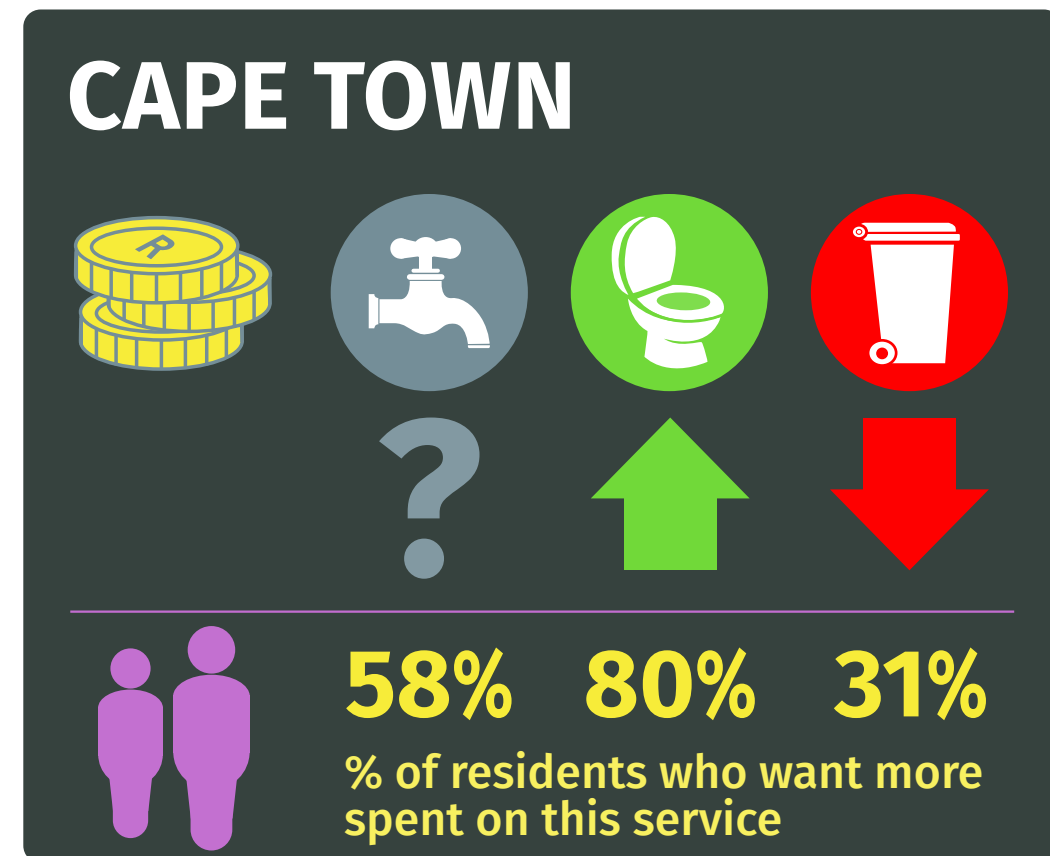
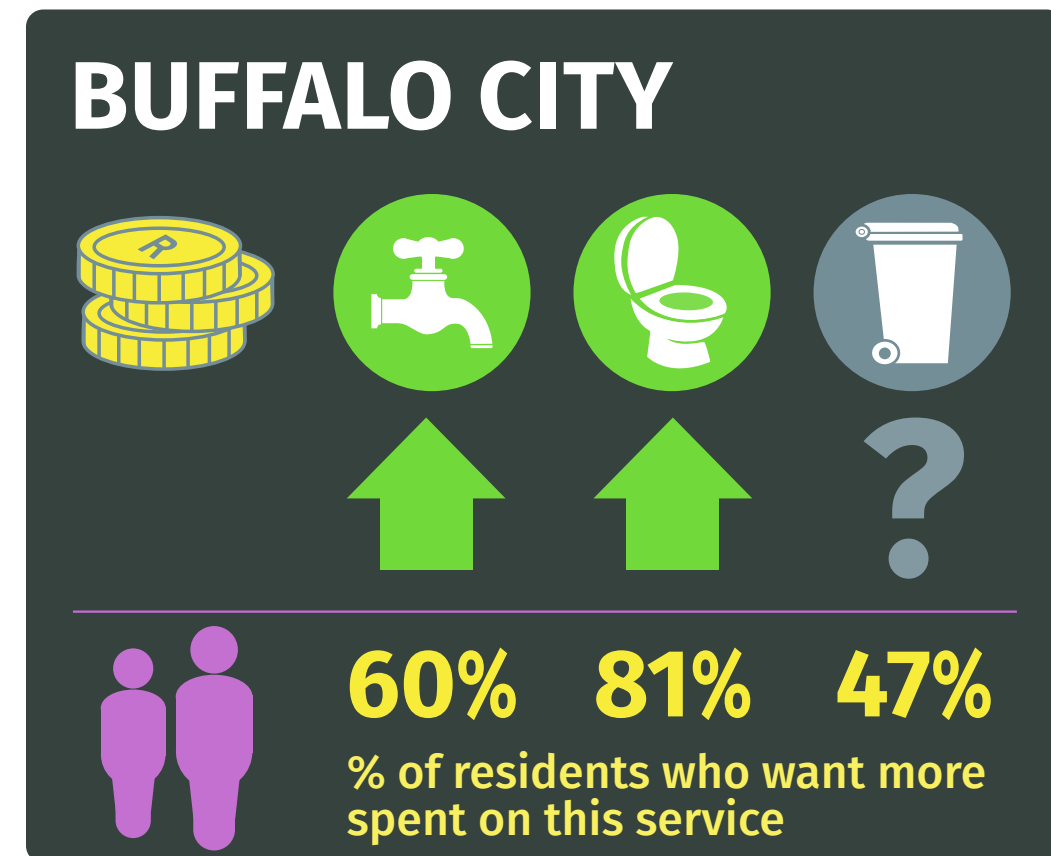


BUDGET 2022/23: What Metros proposed vs. what residents want

Informal settlement residents took a close look at all eight draft metro budgets and decided how metros should change them. In addition to their recommendations for water, sanitation and refuse removal, they raised two major concerns.

Firstly, metros are very slow to repair taps and toilets or do not do so at all. Yet none of the 8 metros made specific budget allocations to repair and maintain informal settlement taps and toilets. Secondly, informal settlements are often worst affected by frequent floods, fires, and other disasters. Therefore, more money should be allocated to improve speedy and adequate responses for relief.

None of the metros allocated a separate budget for informal settlement **REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE**
